Throughout the year we work with the communities of Hangleton and Knoll, East Brighton and Moulsecoomb and Bevendean on:

Artist-in-Residence Programme

Each spring, Artists work together with the steering groups to create innovative, accessible artistic projects with community inclusion at their heart. These always culminate in a celebratory sharing during the Brighton Festival in May.

Audience Club

Through our Audience Club, we provide opportunities for the community to see and participate in free cultural events at Brighton Dome, and in Brighton Festival, as well as across the city.

Primary School Tours

We programme theatre performances into primary schools across the areas to reach as many children as possible. Last year we worked with Half a String Theatre to tour 'Breathe' a live puppetry performance celebrating nature and finding space in a buzzing community.






